Dear Dr. Perry:

On April 29, 2022, the U.S. Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights (OCR) received the complaint you filed against New York University. You alleged that the University discriminates against students on the basis of race by offering: the Science and Technology Entry Program (Allegation 1); and the Visiting Elective for Students Underrepresented in Medicine Program (Allegation 2). OCR is opening the allegations for investigation.

OCR enforces Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (Title VI), as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 2000d *et seq.*, and its implementing regulation at 34 C.F.R. Part 100, which prohibit discrimination on the basis of race, color or national origin in programs and activities receiving financial assistance from the Department. As a recipient of Federal financial assistance from the Department, the University is subject to Title VI.

Please understand that opening the allegations for investigation under Title VI does not mean that OCR has made a decision about the allegations. During the investigation, OCR is neutral; OCR will collect and analyze the evidence it needs to make a decision about the allegations. OCR will ensure that its investigation is legally sufficient and addresses the allegations, as required by OCR's *Case Processing Manual (CPM)*.¹

Please be advised that the University must not harass, coerce, intimidate, discriminate, or otherwise retaliate against an individual because that individual asserts a right or privilege under a law enforced by OCR or files a complaint, testifies, assists, or participates in a proceeding under a law enforced by OCR. If this happens, the individual may file a retaliation complaint against the University with OCR.
